BOARD MEMBER DRESS AND CONDUCT

Board of Education members and district administrators are reminded that they represent the citizens of District #310 and are the ultimate local authority on the operation of the district. As Board of Education members, citizens form opinions about the entire school district operation based on how individual Board of Education members and administrators dress and conduct themselves at Board of Education meetings and public functions.

Acknowledging this scrutiny, Board members and administrators are encouraged to dress appropriately for meetings and public functions and to adhere to the Code of Conduct endorsed by the Illinois Association of School Boards and posted in the Board meeting room. Examples of appropriate dress for men include collared shirts, slacks other than blue jeans, sport coats, suits, and shoes other than tennis shoes. For women, appropriate attire would include dresses, slacks other than blue jeans, blouses, suits, blazers, and shoes other than tennis shoes. The wearing of jackets, overcoats, hats, shorts, T-shirts, jogging suits, or other outside clothing during the meeting or indoor public function is discouraged.

These guidelines are intended to present a professional appearance of the district's managers to the public and are not intended to suppress individuality of expression or personal clothing tastes. They are intended to assist and encourage the Board of Education and the administration to present themselves in a favorable manner to the public they serve.
